Dear Mr. Mollard:

This is further to your letter of May 15, 2007 requesting a review of the RCMP's termination of your complaint of November 23, 2007.

As you are aware, the Chair of the Commission has initiated his own complaint into the RCMP's public disclosure of the status of its criminal investigation regarding the taxation of Canadian corporate dividends and income trusts. For your reference, the scope of the complaint is as follows:


1. whether the RCMP officers involved in the public release of such information complied with all appropriate policies, procedures, guidelines and statutory requirements for the release of such information,
2. whether such policies, procedures and guidelines are adequate to address the situation wherein public disclosure of a police investigation may have an impact upon the democratic process and may call into question public confidence in the independence of the police.

The RCMP investigation into the Chair's complaint is ongoing, and the Commission continues to closely monitor that investigation.

There is a high degree of congruence between the subject matter of your complaint and that of the Chair, and identical relevant materials will likely form the basis of both the Commission's review of the disposition of your complaint and its mandatory review of the disposition of the Chair's complaint. In light of the foregoing and in hopes of greater expediency, the Commission will proceed with your review following the RCMP's disposition of the Chair-initiated complaint.
